



- The majority of students come from DHS and also from WHS
- On average, 20-40 students transfer back to their home school per semester.


SAFETY PROTOCOLS FOR IN-PERSON LEARNING


- Masks must be worn indoors and outdoors (e.g. classroom, office, quad, basketball courts, etc.), all persons* (students, staff, etc.) are required to wear a mask that covers the nose and mouth
- Air purifiers installed in each classroom and building
- Students may bring their water bottle to use the refillable water stations
- ▶ Additional cleaning measures
- Additional hand-washing and hand sanitizing stations throughout campus
- ▶ Additional open air seating options

GENERAL CAMPUS RULES (HIGHLIGHTS)

- Same as DHS and WHS
- Safe and drug free campus is CRITICAL
- Parents/ visitors must be cleared through office; students are not allowed to bring non-enrolled minors to class/campus
- This is a closed campus. Unless with a staff, students must remain in the center quad areas during breaks & between classes. Parking lots, athletic fields, areas behind buildings near the garden & Adult School programs & being in front of the school campus, are OFF LIMITS.
- Students are NOT allowed to leave campus during breaks, lunch or school hours UNLESS you have an off-campus pass obtained from the main office; otherwise, you may be marked absent, truant or cited by Downey PD
- No roaming to OFF LIMITS areas or off campus
- Store skateboards and bikes at locking station, not in the office

STEPS TO SUCCESS

CHS has 10 evaluation periods, there are currently 9 left. At the end of each evaluation period, students are placed on the step they have earned per the number of credits they've earned and their attendance rate for that evaluation. A letter, email, dialer and text is sent to parent/guardian/student monthly to inform Step level.



STEP 1



Excellent!

Keep up the great work!!! ▶





Standard: 100% of credits needed to earn that session and 85–100% attendance.

Rewards: step one certificate, award assembly, a recognition contact/letter to parent/guardian, assorted prizes or privileges, approved to participate in special activities

Eligible for: work permit, prom, homecoming, transfer to WHS / DHS at semester



STEP 2

- Satisfactory progress
- On track to graduate from Columbus HS

- Standard: 100% of credits needed to earn that session & 84% or less attendance rate
- Rewards: a letter to parent/guardian and may include approval to participate in special activities.
- Eligible for: work permit, prom, homecoming
- NOT eligible to: transfer to WHS / DHS at the semester with less than 85% attendance rate

STEP 3

- AT-RISK OF DROPOUT
- NOT On track to graduate



- Standard: earned *less than* 100% of credits needed for the evaluation
- NOT Eligible for: work permit, prom, homecoming, transfer to WHS / DHS
- Mandatory Step 3 Parent-Teacher

 Meeting: parent/guardian, student,
 and teacher(s) designed to discuss
 lack of progress as well as create a
 plan to get back on track to graduate


CHS Credit Check GUIDE Find it on Student/Parent Connect

At CHS, graduation and credit goals are tailored to the student. CHS students earn one credit at a time and see their progress in real time on the credit sheet. CHS students are expected to earn one credit about every 10 days of classwork. At the end of every month, CHS teachers input the number of credits students have earned.

Traditional schools record if students earned 0 or 5 credits per class, per semester.

Welding Pathway



Downey Unified's Welding Pathway offers students the opportunity to begin the pursuit of a highly rewarding and respected career option that is in high demand. This pathway is the first step on a path towards becoming licensed and certified with the American Welding Society (AWS). With technical lectures and demonstrations on industrial fabrication equipment along with plenty of hands-on experience, the Welding Pathway prepares students for trade school and entry-level work in welding-related fields.

Did you know...

- · A career in welding does not require the traditional 4- to 5-years of college
- Welders can make between \$85,000 and \$107,000 per year

Welding supplies will be provided free of cost to our students

What is a Welding Pathway?

The Downey Unified Welding Pathway will be equivalent to the Cerritos College course: WELD 100 Welding Fundamentals (2.5 units)

DUSD Year 1: Weld 100: fall and spring semesters (180 hours total)

DUSD Year 2: Second course


- · Each semester course offers 5 original credits and is not recommended for credit recovery
- · Each course meets a-g criteria needed for high school diploma or application to CSU and UC
- · Offers forklift certification: student must be 18+ years of age


