

- 7. At the beginning of each grading period, record long-term/short-term goals in your agenda.
- 8. Use the space at the bottom of the agenda page to record your daily reflection, clarifying questions, and new goals. This space may also be used for communication to and from parents.
- 9. Your parents are an integral part of the team and should sign your agendaeach week.
- 10. Never remove pages from your agenda to show completion of activities. Instead, fold down the corner of the page or make a check mark next to the date.

Griffiths Expectations for Student Success

We believe each student has the right to learn and each teacher has the right to teach without interruptions. Therefore, all students will follow the PBIS expectations of:

Be Respectful – By Treating others with Respect, using good manners, Being considerate of others, and dealing peacefully without threatening, hitting or hurting anyone with words and/ or actions.

Be Responsible – Attending school every day and on time to ALL classes, planning ahead and setting goals, being diligent and responsible to complete tasks, and be accountable for your words, actions and attitudes

Be Safe – By keeping Griffiths a Bully-free, Violence-free, Drug-free, Discrimination-free school. Students will be encouraged to keep their hands, feet, bodies and words to themselves. Remember: Teaching and learning need to be distraction and disruption free.

A Culture of Community

ACTIVITIES for STUDENTS

Griffiths has many clubs and afterschool activities, as well as dances, lunchtime activities and student performing arts programs.

Students may also participate in the intramural sports program and/or try out for after school sports teams that compete against teams from the other district middle schools.

ELIGIBILITY FOR ALL EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

All students who participate in some extracurricular activities must maintain a C (2.0 GPA) average with not more than two D's and/or F's. Achievement grades of E, S, and N count as 3, 2, and 1, respectively, in computing grade point averages.

Eligibility will be based on the previous grading period. Eligibility must be maintained through the sport season.

A student on suspension is ineligible to attend or participate in extra-curricular activities throughout the period of suspension. Any student receiving more than two 5's (unsatisfactory) incitizenship on the report card will be ineligible for that grading period.

ASB - ASSOCIATED STUDENT BODY

The ASB at Griffiths Middle School is a great opportunity for students who are interested in developing the qualities,

skills, and behaviors of a good leader. While developing personal leadership skills, students will have hands-on experience in: 1) planning, coordinating, executing and evaluating student activities; 2) raising money to fund these activities; and 3) approving budgets and spending of ASB funds.

Students apply in the spring to serve a oneyear commitment and can choose to run for a specific ASB position or just serve on a committee. There are about 20-30 students selected for ASB each year.

ATHLETICS

Participating in athletics not only promotes physical activity and a healthy lifestyle, it also allows students a chance to develop self-discipline and interpersonal skills such as teamwork and communication.

Griffiths Middle School offers the following:

Requirements:

There are three main requirements to sign up for a sport.

- Student must maintain a 2.0 GPA along with good citizenship
- 2. Must have a completed Physical Evaluation Form on file
- 3. Must have an Emergency Card on file

AVID

AVID stands for Advancement Via Individual Determination. The program helps students develop learning, study, and academic behavioral skills that are essential to success in rigorous coursework. AVID acts as a catalyst for schools to develop a culture of college readiness for all students across the campus.

Students take the AVID elective course in 7th and 8th grade that provides them with the skills needed to be successful in advancing academically with the ultimate goal of attending college. Immersed in a college-culture, students are taught:

- Study skills
- Note-taking
- Time management
- Writing and research skills

Students in the AVID elective receive daily instruction and support to prepare them for college from a trained AVID elective teacher, as well as access to college tutors, dynamic guest speakers, team building activities, and field trips to local colleges and universities.

CAREER TECHNICAL EDUCATION

Career Technical Education (CTE) provides students with the opportunity to acquire real-life skills to prepare them for successful, continuing education or entry-level career positions. Each CTE course offers relevant project-based activities modeled by professionals from the field. Stauffer CTE courses feed directly into the CTE courses at

Warren High School.

Students in CTE classes learn by:

- Exploring career interests and goals
- Learning employability and job skills
- Creating a personal portfolio
- Obtaining work experience
- · Preparing for advanced career training
- · Competing in industry competitions

Classes include but are not limited to:

- Computer Science
- Culinary Arts
- Drama
- Film and Television
- Journalism
- PLTW Design and Modeling
- PLTW Green Architecture
- Robotics

CJSF, SCHOLARSHIP & HONOR ROLL ELIGIBILITY

At Griffiths, we reward excellent student achievement and behavior in many ways. Honor roll recognizes students with a

- 4.0 GPA. Scholarship Club and CJSF are available for students with high academic standing. At the end of the school year, awards are given in the areas of service, attendance, citizenship, school spirit, scholarship, and academic excellence.

CJSF - CALIFORNIA JUNIOR SCHOLARSHIP FEDERATION

Students must apply within the given time frame to be a member of CJSF.

Advisors will announce the dates of the application period. The student has the responsibility of applying for membership on the approved form and during the set application period. Under no circumstances may retroactive membership be granted to a student who has failed to apply at the proper time.

All second (Spring) semester seventh grade and eighth grade students are eligible. Other eligibility requirements are as follows:

- 1. A satisfactory citizenship grade is required. A member may have no 4's or 5's on their report card. Students who are eligible but who, in the judgment of the Principal or advisor are unworthy citizens, shall be debarred from membership.
- 2. All grades earned the previous semestermust be the equivalent of a C or better. A grade of D or F shall debar for that semester.
- 3. Members must have earned 10 points based on semester grades. This is based on points earned in 5 subjects.

Each A = 3 points, each B = 1 point. Exceptions:

Seventh grade Pre-Algebra B's = 2 points, Eighth grade Honors English B's = 2 points, Eighth grade Algebra B's = 2 points.

Meetings will be held the first Thursday of each month. Honors Night awards are based on each semester of membership.

COMMUNITY SERVICE

The students of Griffiths Middle School are expected to demonstrate good citizenship and character, and become conscientious and moral people in their community, contributing to a better world.

FEMINEERS

The Femineer Program was created by <u>Cal</u> <u>Poly Pomona's College of Engineering</u> in 2013 to inspire additional females to pursue STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math) in their education and career.

At Griffiths, this highly creative program provides 7th and 8th-grade students with project-based learning, female engineering student mentors and opportunities to visit Cal Poly Pomona, while building a sustainable program and community for current and future STEM leaders.

By engaging with real-world applications and hands-on activities, Femineers acquire the technical knowledge and practical skills necessary to become confident and strong in their future careers

GATE

The GATE program at Griffiths Middle School is designed with two goals in mind. The first goal is to provide students with

access to the most rigorous coursework that allows them to apply their learning utilizing an inquiry-based model. The second goal is to provide students with experiences and opportunities that develop their talents and capabilities educationally, socially and culturally

At Griffiths, we aim to have our GATE Students thrive to become strong, well-rounded students who are supported in their educational, extra-curricular, and social-emotional needs as they prepare to become college and career ready, globally competitive and citizens of character.

How do I know if my student qualifies?

Students in the top CASSP testing levels are identified by school site

Teachers and/or parents can request testing through the GATE Lead at the site if the student meets the top level in CAASSP English/Math testing

Students take a nationally recognized test at the site. If students score 70% or higher on the reasoning test, they move on to the next steps:

- Student GPAs are recorded
- Students' critical thinking skills are gathered from their teachers
- Qualification Packet is reviewed by a team of GATE Leads

GOOD MORNING GRIFFITHS

Each day the video production class hosts a news and entertainment broadcast to keep you informed about what's going on around Griffiths.

If you are interested in being a part of the

GMG broadcast, the Video Production elective is open to all 7th and 8th grade students.

INTRAMURAL SPORTS

The Intramural sports program is voluntary and open to all GMS students. Every student is encouraged to participate. Students will be given the opportunity to learn and compete in many different team sports (basketball, soccer, softball, volleyball, flag football, track and field, dance, and weight room.

Each student will be placed on a team and theteams will play against each other. Students participating in an Intramural sport must have a signed parent consent form on file with the P.E. department to play.

LIBRARY

The library can be used by any student attending Griffiths Middle School and is open before school, at snack and lunch, and after school. The library is closed Friday during snack.

During class time, students must be accompanied by a teacher or must have a signedpass from their teacher to work in the library. Lost or damaged library books must be paid for.

MUSIC PROGRAMS

The Griffiths Band provides a unique opportunity to excel in a culture of excellence. Each of the ensembles/classes offers students a safe and community-based environment to not only improve their

musical skills and knowledge but also foster critical life skills such as dedication, teamwork, self-discipline, time management and responsibility.

The Griffiths Middle School Choir continues to establish a reputation for excellence at the local, regional and national levels. From classical to gospel to jazz to pop, there is something for everyone.

PERSONAL PROPERTY

The school cannot be responsible for the loss or destruction of students' personal property, including electronic devices. For this reason, valuable items are not to be brought to school.

The lost and found is in the main office. Every ten weeks, unclaimed property is donated to charity or discarded.

RECREATION PROGRAM

All students are welcome to participate in open recreation.

Open recreation will be held before school on the basketball courts Monday through Friday from 7:15 a.m. to 7:45 a.m.

During lunch students are encouraged to use the recreation area for basketball, four-square, soccer, kickball and other sports activities.

Sports equipment if provided by the school so students are **NOT allowed to** bring their own personal athletic equipment is allowed oncampus.

Students will compete in recreation activities with quality sportsmanship and respect for others.

SCHOLARSHIP CLUB

Students must apply for membership during the application period. Membership requirements are as follows:

- 1. First semester sixth grade and second semester sixth grade, grade averages will be used as a basis for eligibility.
- 2.A satisfactory citizenship record is required. Amember may have no 4's or 5's on their report card. Students who are eligible but who in the judgment of the Principal and the Advisor and unworthy citizen, shall be debarred from membership.
- 3. All grades earned from the previous semestermust be a C or better. A grade of D or F shall debar for the semester.

SNACK & LUNCH

A 16-minute snack period is provided every morning. You may bring a snack from home or purchase food on campus. All food must remain in the quad during snack and lunch.

Lunch is 30 minutes long. Complete lunches may be bought in the cafeteria. Separate items such as hamburgers, pizza, ice cream, milk, etc., are sold at the snack shack and food carts. Many students bring sack lunches from home.

All food must be eaten in the quad area. Information regarding reduced and free-lunch programs is available from the cafeteria manager. When finished eating,

students may visit with friends or participate in recreation activities in the P.E. area during the lunch period.

On rainy days special instructions will be given as to where students may spend the lunch period. The following rules must be observed during the lunch and snack periods:

- No sitting on tabletops.
- ·Walk to the lunch line.
- No cutting in line.
- No pushing or shoving.
- ·Place all trash in containers.
- •No food outside of the quad area.
- •Follow all lunch supervisor instructions.

Students are not allowed to go to classrooms unless given permission by a lunch supervisor.

of all our students, the office will not accept outside food, drink AND 3rd party deliveries (UBEREats, PostMates, etc.) during the school day. All food deliveries will be turned away by office staff, and 3rd party deliveries will be at the customer's expense.

WEB – Where Everyone Belongs

WEB is a selected team of 8th-grade students who mentor all incoming 6th graders in order to help them feel welcomed and confident as they begin their new journey in middle school.

WEB welcomes all 6th graders to our summer orientation where students can meet other classmates, build new friendships, and start to get familiar with the campus. WEB has monthly activities for WEB Leaders and 6th graders to build positive relationships and social skills, connect with one another and, above all, have fun!

WELLNESS CENTER

The Griffiths Middle School Wellness Center offers students a mental health onestop-shop where they have access to counseling, clinical therapy, community referrals more. resource and Our professionals provide a wide variety of services and programs to address overcoming life's obstacles. Additionally, students can walk-in and engage in mindful activities and/or build social skills through game-based activities. All students are encouraged to utilize the Wellness Center. Our goal is that students will leave the center emotionally regulated and ready to re-engage in their studies.

BOOK BAGS & BACKPACKS

Griffiths Middle School does not have hall lockers for regular student use. Students are encouraged to carry book bags or backpacks. Teachers will expect students to use their time wisely, complete assignments, and do their best at all times. Lack of materials, failure to follow directions, lack of effort, or misbehavior will not be permitted. Continued violation of classroom regulations may result in removal from class, school, or both.

Good campus behavior is stressed as well as classroom conduct. Students will be held responsible for maintaining a neat and orderly campus and following all rules both in and out of class.

HOMEWORK

Students should expect approximately one hour of homework &/or studying each school night To organize your homework, use this Griffiths Guide for each period. Put in time on reading, studying for an upcoming quiz or test, or completing a long-term project or report.

MAKE-UP WORK

Following an excused absence, a student has the same number of days as he or she was absent to make up work. Students are responsible for all class work missed due to school activities, i.e. field trips, programs, club activities, etc.

MEDICATION

Under no circumstances are students to be in possession of medication once they arrive at school.

A doctor's authorization must be obtained before medicine is brought to school. It should include dosage, frequency, and time limits. Parents and doctor must fill out a written form available from the office. Medication that must be on campus willbe kept in the office and the student will be allowed to go to the office to maintain the medication schedule. Medication should be in the prescription container and clearly labeled stating the contents, schedule, dosage, physician, and the student's name.

Students will be responsible for administrating their own medication. A school employee may observe, but not assist in any way.

Aspirin is considered a medication and written (not verbal) permission must be on file inthe school office

REPORT CARDS

Progress reports are issued every six weeks and report cards are issued at the end of each semester. A letter grade (A, B, C, D, F) is given for academic and elective classes. Exploratory and physical education classes are graded Excellent, Satisfactory, or Needs Improvement (E, S, N). The need for improvement in behavior, attendance, and assignments is also noted with number comments. Progress Reports and First Semester Report Cards will be given to the students to take home approximately one week after the end of each reporting period. Second Semester Report Cards are mailed home approximately one week after the end of school. Letters regarding poor scholarship or attendance are regularly mailed home.

Grade point average is the average of all

earned letter grades calculated with the following numeric values: A=4, B=3, C=2, D=1, F=0, E=4, S+=3, S=2, S-=1, N=0

Students must have earned 8 points. Each A = 3 points, each B = 1 pointB in top math = 2 points.

If you are transferring from Griffiths Middle School to another school, a parent or guardian must notify the Attendance Office prior to the last day of attendance. You

will be given a check-out sheet to be signed by all of your teachers. You will need to turn in all textbooks and library books you have checked out. When this sheet is completed, the office will prepare a transfer for you to take to your new school.

SCHOOL RULES

The Griffiths Middle School staff's goal is to provide a safe orderly environment where teachers are free to teach, and students can learn through a fair and consistently applied discipline program. working together, we can provide a safe, pleasant, and academically rewarding environment where students can achieve maximum success. School rules apply on campus always, not just during school hours.

The complete School Discipline Policy is available online and printed in the Griffiths Guide.

SCHOOL DISCIPLINE POLICY

REVISED 4/4/23

The purpose of this policy is to ensure a system of effective discipline supported by students, school personnel and parents. We are making every effort to ensure that Griffiths Middle School is a safe place for our students and staff members. Working together, we can provide a safe, pleasant and academically rewarding environment in which students can achieve a maximum level of success.

Please be aware that school rules, as required by California State Law, apply during school hours, at any school related activity, and when traveling to school or back home.

ATTENDANCE, TARDIES, TRUANCY

No student should be absent, tardy, or out of class without a valid reason. School Policy states that students must be in your seat when the tardy bell begins to ring. A student is considered truant when they are absent from school, class, or more than 30 minutes late, without permission.

BICYCLES, SKATEBOARDS, ROLLER BLADES, SCOOTERS, ATHLETIC EQUIPMENT, ETC

Bicycles, skateboards, or any other wheeled device may not be ridden on campus. Bicycles, skateboards, scooters, and roller blades must be locked in the provided area. Personal athletic equipment is not allowed on campus. School is not responsible for replacing lost, stolen or damaged items.

BOUNDARIES

Students are to remain in assigned areas during snack and lunch. Students are not allowed in staff parking areas at any time. All students with food must remain in the student quad. Students who are finished eating may participate in games on the

basketball courts and athletic fields during lunch only. Students are not permitted in the halls during lunch or snack. Cutting in line, leaving trash or throwing food will not be tolerated.

BEYOND THE CONTROL OF SCHOOL AUTHORITIES

Any student who is persistently in violation of numerous classroom, school, District, or legal policies, and who does not respond usual corrective measures. considered beyond the control of school authorities. In this case, the parent is held responsible for all possible help in correcting the behavioral problems. Depending on the situation, any or all of the following may be considered: parent requested and/or required to attend class with student, parent requested to come to school and remove the student. assignment of an alternate school, off campus suspension, referral to outside counseling and/or juvenile authorities, contact District Office for possible expulsion hearing or removal from school.

BULLYING

Bullying and harassment are not tolerated at Griffiths Middle School. Bullying and harassment have two key elements:

they involve potentially harmful words or actions repeated over sufficient time to causebeing at school to become grossly uncomfortable for the victim (known in the lawas hostile atmosphere) there is a significant social or physical imbalance

between the perpetrator and thevictim. If a student feels he/she is a victim of bullying at school, he/she needs to report it immediately to a teacher, counselor, or administrator. Students receive resources during anti-bullying week each year and throughout the year regarding their rights, responsibilities, how toreport, and what to expect when bullying is reported. School and families will work together to respond appropriately to bullying, and disciplinary action will result when necessary.

CHEATING AND PLAGIARISM

Cheating is considered an action which is not honest. Copying the test or papers of another student is considered cheating. A student who supplies papers or work for someone to copy or does the work for someone is also guilty of cheating. Two or more students working together on an assignment that was to be completed by an individual will also be considered cheating. Plagiarism is the act of taking work from another source and turning it in as your own. Plagiarism will be considered as an act of cheating.

CLASSROOM DISRUPTION, FAILURE TO FOLLOW RULES

Teachers have the authority to develop rules for their individual classrooms. To assure maximum learning, teachers will issue classroom rules/expectations which must be followed. Parents will be contacted as necessary if students fail to maintain proper class behavior and/or follow classroom expectations.

CLOSED CAMPUS, CAMPUS HOURS

Griffiths Middle School is a closed campus. No student may leave the campus at any time without the permission of the school attendance office and a written office pass. Downey Police may cite a student who is off campus without a written school pass. It is a violation of State Law for anyone to enter a campus during school hours unless entry is granted by the school administration. Everyone must stop at the office before coming on campus. Regular school day hours at Griffiths Middle School are from 7:55 a.m. until 2:38 p.m. Students are supervised on campus from 7:35 a.m. until 2:53 p.m. Students are expected to exit campus in an expedited manner after school, unless part of school and/or district approved programs.

DISRESPECT, DEFIANCE OF AUTHORITY

Any student that is discourteous, impolite, or rude to school personnel is guilty of disrespect. Defiance is refusal to follow a staff member's directions. Failure to serve detention may be considered defiance of authority.

DISRUPTION OF SCHOOL ACTIVITIES

Students violating school rules at any school activity may be asked to leave and further action, as necessary, will be taken. Students having unserved detention or major behavioral violations will not be admitted to school activities. Students may be placed on school probation, where future behavior will be agreed upon and carefully monitored.

Any student violating the probation agreement may be transferred to another school and/or denied participation in future activities which includes promotion exercises, dances, and year-end activities. Any misbehavior on school field trips will be considered a violation of school rules.

DRESS CODE

While on campus or at any school activity, students will be dressed and groomed in a manner which will not distract, interfere or disrupt the educational program or create a safety hazard for themselves or others.

Griffiths Middle School desires to keep the school and students free of the intimidation and harmful influence of any dangerous or harmful groups which advocate drugs, alcohol, tobacco, violence, or disruptive behavior. Therefore, the presence of any grooming which by virtue of its color, arrangement, trademark or any other attribute denotes affiliation with or membership in such a group is strictly prohibited.

All students who come to school without proper attention having been given to personal cleanliness or neatness of dress may be sent home to be properly prepared for school. Additional disciplinary action may be taken as necessary.

The Griffiths Middle School standards of student dress and grooming are as follows:

CONDITION: All clothes must be properly

sized, neat, clean, and in good repair.

MESSAGE: Logos, pictures or writing on clothing, backpacks, jewelry, and/or school supplies must be age appropriate and not advocate any of the following: drugs, alcohol, tobacco, sex, violence, vandalism, disruptive behavior, disrespect, gang activity, or in any way display profanity, obscene illustrations, illegal activity or degrade any gender, cultural, religious or ethnic values, nor promote one ethnic group over another.

UNDERGARMENTS: Undergarments must be worn at all times and must not be visible at any time.

TOPS: Shirts and tops must have sleeves, cover the stomach and back always. Halter/crop tops, tube tops, tank tops, muscle tees, under tank(s), spaghetti straps, see-through tops, bare midriffs, or low-cuttops are not permitted.

PANTS, SHORTS, AND SKIRTS: Must cover the buttocks and undergarments. All bottoms must be worn at the waist always (no sagging). Shorts, skirts, etc. must extend to at least the mid-thigh. The bottom of the short(s) must be no longer than the bottom of the knee. "Distressed" (fraying, cuts, holes, rips, etc.) areas must not be higher than mid-thigh.

SHOES: Safe footwear must be worn always. Students may not wear open toe sandals, slides, and/or slippers. All shoes must have a sturdy back/heel of shoe. Shoes with heels higher than one inch are

not allowed.

JEWELRY/ACCESSORIES: Jewelry that poses a safety hazard or that distracts from the educational process is not permitted. This includes pant/wallet chains and hoop earrings that are larger than a nickel in diameter. BLANKETS ARE NOT PERMITTED ON CAMPUS ANY TIME.

HEAD WEAR: Hats may be worn outside on campus and must be removed when in class or any other building. Sports headbands, hair nets, and bandannas are not allowed on campus. Sweatshirt hoods must be removed upon entering the office, classrooms, and other buildings, etc.

GANG APPAREL: Gang related apparel is not allowed. Any combination of clothing that law enforcementagencies currently consider gang related will not be allowed at Griffiths Middle School.

DRUGS, ALCOHOL, WEAPONS, OTHER MAJOR OFFENSES

Using, giving, or selling to another person, or in possession of, drugs, alcohol, weapons, look-alike weapons (example: air soft pellet gun, rubber knife, etc.) or dangerous objects on campus is strictly forbidden. Any overt actor threat directed at a student, teacher or other school employee is also a serious violation.

The act of smoking or the mere possession of tobacco, cigarettes, and/or electronic vape products by a minor is illegal and is considered a violation of this policy. Cigarette lighters, matches, or other tobacco

related paraphernalia are not permitted on campus at any time.

ELECTRONICS AND CELL PHONES

Cell phones are permitted on campus in accordance with California State law. In accordance with that law, cell phones must remain turned off and put away during the school day (7:55 a.m. - 2:38 p.m.) unless being used with permission for educational purposes. Cell phones and electronic (including items headphones / AirPods/etc.) that are brought to school, are brought entirely at the risk of the owner. The school will not be responsible for the loss, theft, or destruction of electronic items or cell phones. Electronics and cell phones being used without permission or for noneducational purposes will be confiscated and only released to a parent. Students whose electronics and/or cell phones are confiscated may receive a Saturday School assignment.

EXPLOSIVES

Firecrackers, fireworks, and other explosives are illegal, dangerous and never permitted at school or any school activity. Simple possession of such materials is a violation of this policy. Lighting or attempting to light or explode such materials is a serious and major violation of school policy.

FIGHTING

Fighting is defined as "causing and/or threatening to cause physical injury to

student(s)or school personnel, and/or willfully using force or violence on another." Pushing, shoving, play-fighting, etc., are all considered to be fighting. Self-defense is not an acceptable excuse.

FORGERY

Forgery is the act of a student signing a parent's, teacher's, or other school employee's name or altering such signature or other mark such as a grade, date, time, etc. If a student impersonates such person by voice on the telephone, he or she will be guilty of forgery.

MARKER PENS & GRAFFITI

Pride in the school's appearance and reputation is the responsibility of the whole student body. Drawing or writing on school buildings, posts, desks, restroom walls, or damaging any other property by writing or drawing on it is called graffiti. This rule applies to any time of day including before school, after school, at night or on the weekend. Students found seriously damaging property will be suspended, issued a citation, the police notified, a possible expulsion hearing, and the parents required to pay for all damages.

OTHER SCHOOL CAMPUSES

Students are not permitted to be on another school campus before, during, or after school without the permission of the principal of the other school. If a student is going to another school to walk a younger brother or sister to or from school, they must wait off the campus, out of the buildings and

outside the school gates and leave as soon as possible after meeting your brother or sister. Students are notpermitted to take short cuts through other school grounds on their way to or from school.

PARTY FLIERS & ADVERTISEMENTS

It is against school rules to bring written material to school that advertises nonschool activities. When materials are passed at school by students, sometimes think that the school supports the activity. If the school feels an activity is safe and is sponsored by a legitimate organization, materials would be made available to those interested in the school office. Party fliers may never be distributed by students at school. Party fliers may not be brought to school or be in the possession of students on campus. Students bringing party fliers to school or having them in their possession at school will have the fliers taken away and will face disciplinary action.

PROFANITY, VULGARITY, OBSCENE MATERIAL

No student is permitted to use profane or vulgar language at any time while at school or any school activity. Any profanity directed at or about a teacher or any other school employee will be considered an extreme violation. Profanity includes spoken and/or written expression.

PROHIBITED ITEMS ON CAMPUS

Items which are dangerous, problematic or distractive are banned from campus. Prohibited items that are brought on campus will be confiscated. Confiscated items may be held for a parent to pick up, held for the remainder of the semester, held for the remainder of the school year, turned over to the District, or turned over to law enforcement authorities. Items being held for a parent, and not picked up by the end of the school year will be donated to charity or discarded. The school will not be responsible for the loss or destruction of contraband items. Contraband items include, but are not limited to:

- Any item that is illegal for minors to possess.
- Any item that poses a danger or is disruptive to the educational process.
- All medication (prescription and over the counter) must be checked into the office by a parent or guardian. Arrangements will be made for the student to use the medicine under the supervision of officestaff. Students may not carry medication (prescription or otherwise) on campus unless arrangements have been made in writing by a doctor and the Griffiths office staff.
- Items that have no educational purpose including but not limited to gum, toys, permanent markingpens, imitation electronic cigarettes.
- Students may not sell items on campus to make money for themselves.

For the health and safety of our students, third

party food deliveries are NOT allowed. All third-partyfood deliveries, including UBEREats and PostMates, will be turned away at customer's expense.

SELLING THINGS ON CAMPUS

Student clubs, the Griffiths Student Body in general, and organizations of various kinds often have fund raising activities where things are sold on campus. Sale of anything must be approved by the office and Student Council. These sales are to help earn money for activities and school materials. Items sold may include candy, novelty items, cards, etc., and are always approved before the sale with the safety of students in mind. Fund raising candy may not be sold on campus. No fund-raising food items may be sold at snack or lunch.

It is always against school rules for individuals to sell things on campus to make money for themselves. Students selling things on campus against school rules will have the items taken away, and possible disciplinary action taken. Students may not sell things on campus for other off-campus groups unless the selling has been specifically approved by the office in advance. Selling things for other groups interferes with the ability of official Griffiths organizations to make money to support their activities.

Sometimes students make very poor decisions and try to sell things like knives, drugs or things that look like drugs, firecrackers, or "poppers." Selling things of this type will result in the student being

suspended from school and possibly arrested and expelled from the Downey Unified School District.

SEXUAL HARASSMENT

Sexual harassment of or by any employee or of or by any student shall not be allowed. Sexual harassment is prohibited by the Downey Unified School District and may result in disciplinary action to the offending employee or student. Sexual harassment means unwelcome sexual advances, requests for sexual favors, and other verbal, visual or physical conduct of a sexual nature made by someone under any of the conditions delineated in Ed Code.

An individual or group feeling subjected to sexual harassment should directly inform the offending person/persons that such conduct must stop. Any conduct of a sexual nature following such notice may be determined to be sexual harassment. The District will take appropriate action to protect the reporting individual or group from retaliation or other forms of harassment. Incidents of sexual harassment should be reported to school administration.

THEFT OR POSSESSION OF LOST/STOLEN PROPERTY

Theft is defined as the removal of an object from school or from another person, their backpack, desk, locker, purse, etc. without the knowledge and permission of the owner. To knowingly possess lost or stolen property will be considered theft.

VANDALISM

Vandalism is considered willful destruction of school or personal property. The parent or guardian of a minor who willfully cuts, defaces, or otherwise injures in any way, property, real or personal, belonging to the School District, will be liable for all such damages caused by the minor.

CONSEQUENCES

- 1. Failure to comply with the Griffiths School Discipline Policy may result in any of the following consequences:
- 1.1 Referral to a school administrator, counselor, or dean
- 1.2 Parent conference
- 1.3 Assignment of lunch exclusion, campus clean-up, detention, Saturday School, or other discipline assignment(s)
- 1.4 Loss of school privileges (i.e. dances, field trips, athletic participation, etc.)
- 1.5 Community Service
- 1.6 Up to five days of off-campus or inschool suspension
- 1.7 Parent may be required to attend school with their child
- 1.8 Social adjustment transfer of the student to another campus within the Downey Unified School District
- 1.9 Alcohol and Other Drug Contract
- 1.10 Referral to a School Attendance Review Team and/or a School Attendance Review Board hearing
- 1.11 Referral for expulsion from the Downey Unified School District
- 1.12 Police notification, student arrest and removal from school with subsequent legal action.

DETENTION

School detention is assigned before school from 7:00 - 7:50 a.m., or after school from 2:38 - 3:38

p.m. Students are assigned detention by individual teachers for failure to complete assignments, for poor conduct in the classroom, for tardiness, or for lack supplies. Students are given written notice (detention form) prior to all detentions so that their parents can be informed. It is the student's responsibility to notify their parent(s) of the assigned detention.

Failure to serve an assigned detention is considered defiance and may result in Saturday School, or suspension.

REFERRALS

A referral is very serious. Most of the student body can spend three years at Griffiths without getting one referral. When a student's behavior in the classroom is very bad or does not improve no matter what steps the teacher has taken to change the behavior, the teacher writes a referral. The student is sent to the office with the referral. The office decides what needs to be done to change the wrong behavior and takes action. This may be a severe warning, calling the parents, detention, Saturday School, offcampus suspension, or, in very serious situations, transfer to another school or an expulsion hearing with possible expulsion from the Downey Unified School District. Copies of all referrals are kept in the student's file in the office and may be seen by the student's parents upon request.

SATURDAY DETENTION

If a student is involved in serious or repeated violations of school rules or fails to serve teacher or office-assigned detention, he or she may be assigned detention to be served on Saturday. While serving this detention, the students will be required to complete classwork, homework, missing assignments, makeup assignments, reading assignments, projects, etc. Parents will be notified of all Saturday assignments. Saturday detention is often assigned in place of suspension. Any student failing toreport to an assigned Saturday detention will be suspended for one or more days.

SUSPENSION

Suspension is not intended as a punishment, but rather to alert the student and parent that problems are emerging and have reached a serious level that requires parent intervention. The suspended student has disrupted the learning environment or safety of campus.

California teachers and school administrators have a moral and legal duty set downin state law and affirmed by the courts to protect the health and safety of students and preserve the integrity of the classroom environment for self-disciplined learners.

A safe and positive learning environment is an indispensable component of the learning process and

must be consistent and protected.

EXPULSION

Expulsion is the most serious action that can take place for very serious violations of school rules and/or laws. If a student is expelled from the Downey Unified School District, it means that he or she may no longer attend any school in Downey. This becomes a permanent part of the student's school record. If a student is to be expelled, an expulsion hearing is held, and the Board of Education makes the final decision.

SERIOUS VIOLATIONS OF LAWS OR SCHOOL RULES

Acts which endanger the safety or welfare of students or school personnel are grounds for suspension from school. Some of these acts include fighting, intimidation, possession or use of matches, tobacco, narcotics or other drugs, alcohol, explosive devices (including firecrackers), weapons of any type, shooting or throwing objects that might endanger sight or hearing, vandalism, theft, or injury to another person. Students may also be suspended for gambling, profanity, vulgarity, or immorality. Unfortunately, such acts often result in notification of police and/or fire departments, citation by school administration, and/or expulsion from the Downey Unified School District. All off-campus suspensions and expulsion become a permanent part of the student's school records. A more detailed explanation of Griffiths Middle School's rules and regulations are printed in the school's Discipline Policy.

This policy was developed with the assistance and cooperation of parents, teachers, counselors. and school administration. The policy is available online and included in the Griffiths Guide. Please read the Griffiths Middle School Discipline Policy and discuss it with your parents. Special assemblies are held each school year where these policies and consequences of any violations are clearly explained to students. For the purpose of maintaining a safe, secure and peaceful campus, metal detectors, breath alcohol test devices, and/or drug dogs may be used on campus.

RULES & CONSEQUENCES REGARDING CELLPHONES & OTHER ELECTRONICS

Cell Phones are permitted on campus in accordance with California State Law.

In accordance with that law:

Cell phones & other electronic items MUST remain turned off and put away during the school day unless being used with permission of the classroom teacher for educational purposes.

Cell phones and electronic items that are brought to school are brought entirely at the risk of the owner.

The school will not be responsible for the loss, theft, or destruction of electronic itemsor cell phones.

Cell phones being used without permission, or for non-educational purposes, will be confiscated.

CONSEQUENCES:

- INCIDENT 1: Device(s) confiscated; released only to parent/guardian
- INCIDENT 2: Device(s) confiscated; released only to parent or guardian and may receive a 1-hour detention after school (Wednesdays)
- INCIDENT 3: Device(s) confiscated; released only to parent or guardian and may receive a 4-hour (1 day) Saturday School
- INCIDENT 4: Device(s) confiscated and held until end of semester; additional consequences determined by administration
