

# **General Expectations PART 1**

**Criffiths Middle School agrees to implement the following requirements:**

- Spanish translation will be provided at parent functions.
- Parent surveys will be given to determine parent interest needs.
- will provide information about Title I programs to parents of participating children in a timely manner:
- A Fall meeting will be held.
- Written notification will be sent home with all Title I students, explaining the program

Griffiths Middle School will provide to parents of Title I students a description and explanation of the curriculum being used, the forms of academic assessment used to measure student progress, and the proficiency levels students are expected to meet:
