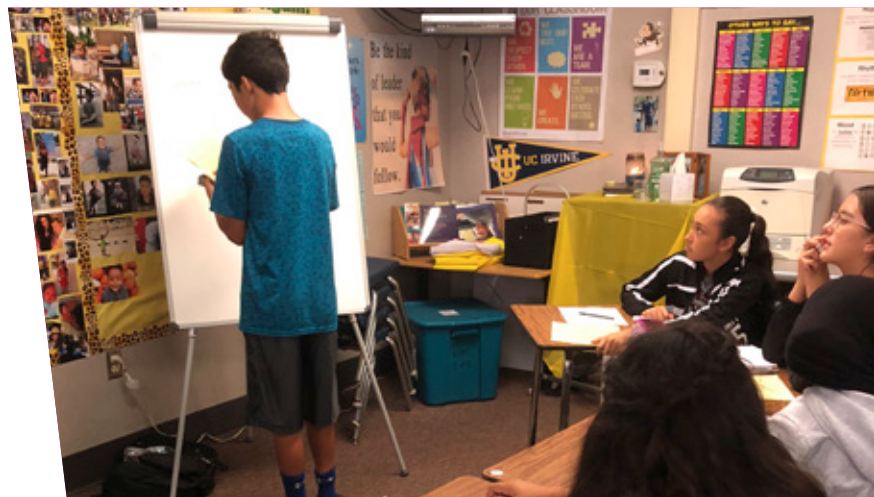

The band family welcomes you to join us. Just register for beginning band and we will take it from there!



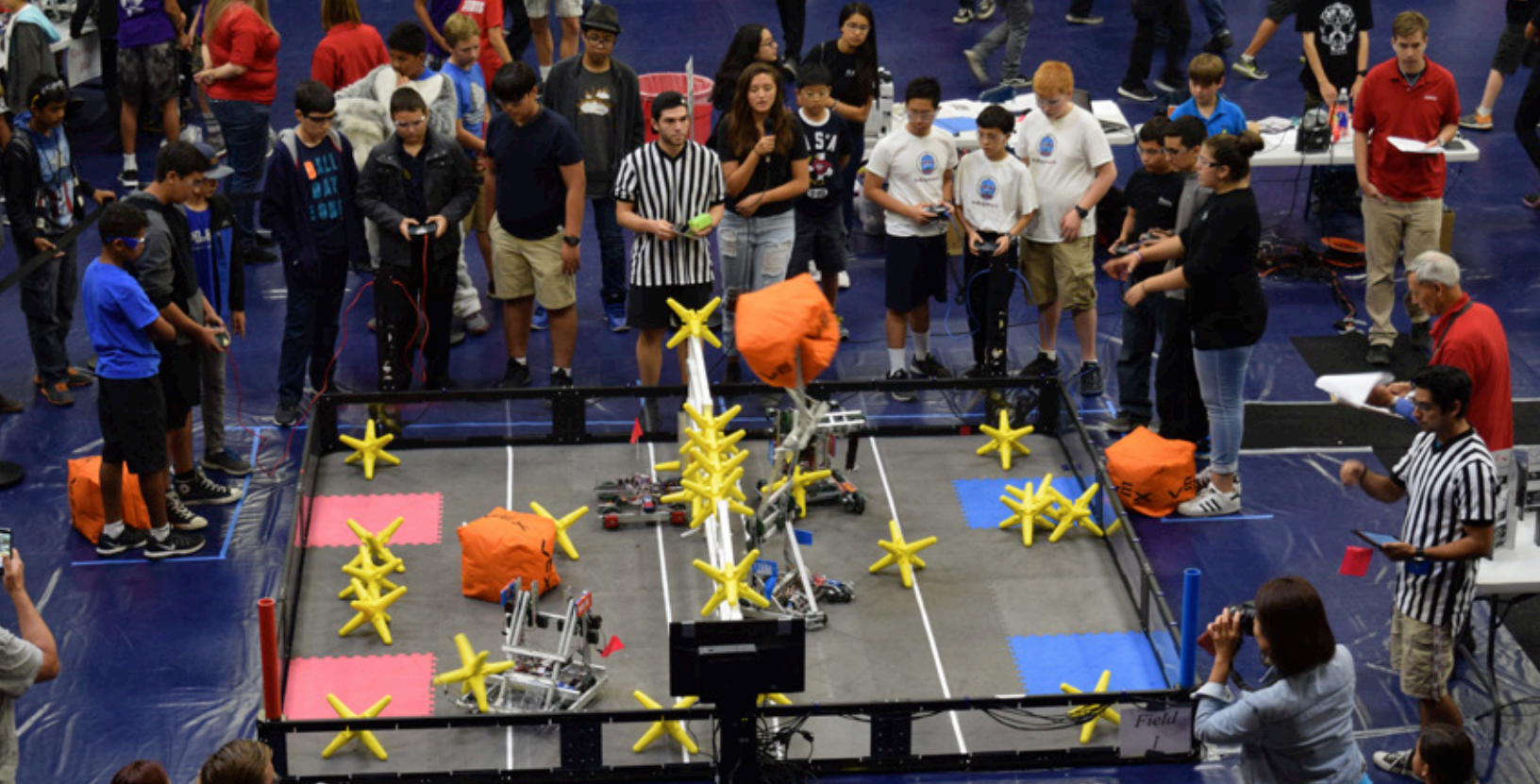
WEB

Academic Opportunities



ADVANCEMENT VIA INDIVIDUAL DETERMINATION (AVID) is a 7th through 12th grade program that prepares students in the academic middle for admission to a four-year college or university. Students take the AVID elective course in 7th and 8th grade that provides them with the skills needed to be successful in advancing academically with the ultimate goal of attending college.

For more than 30 years, AVID has been instrumental in preparing students for success in higher education. Students are taught study skills, note taking, time management, writing and research skills while being immersed in a college-going culture. The class also includes tutoring sessions that are led by college students and provides support for success in the academically rigorous curriculum. Additionally, the AVID class provides access to information about colleges and universities through field trips, guest speakers, college tutors, scholarship opportunities and college admission requirement information.



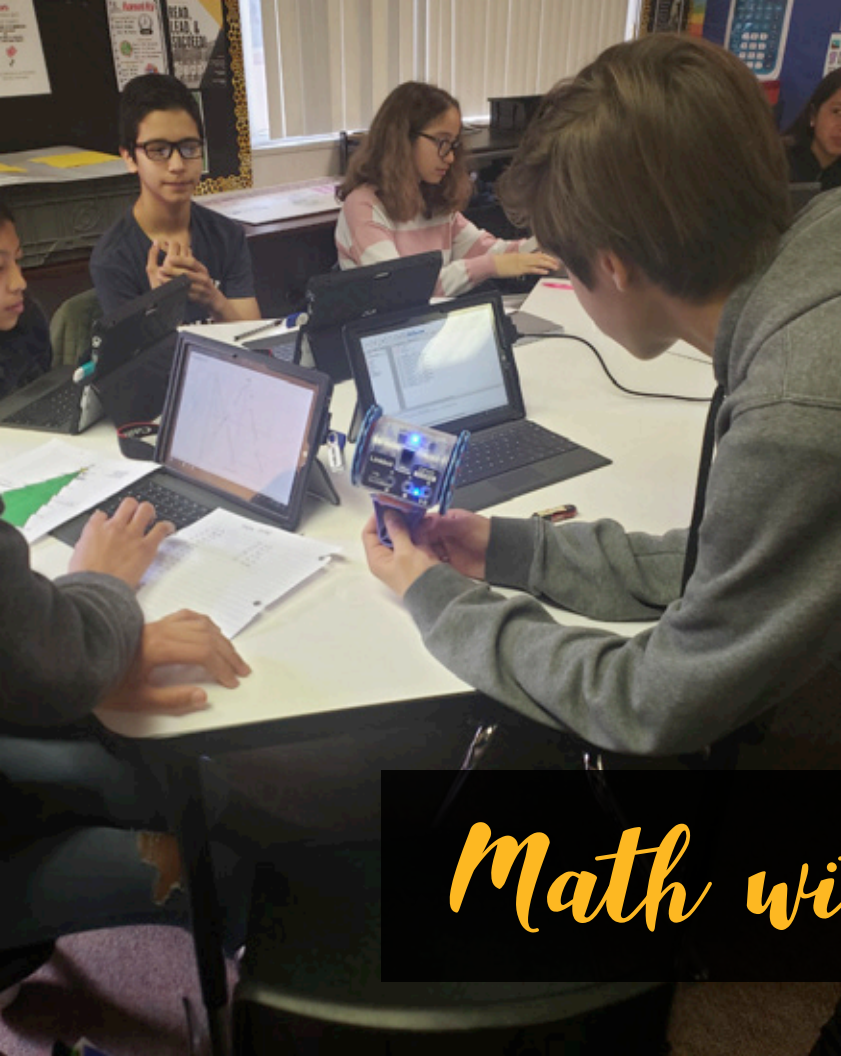


GATE

The GATE program at Stauffer is designed with two goals in mind.

First, to provide access to the most rigorous courses with highly qualified teachers. Secondly, to provide educational experiences that expose students to local university programs and varied resources in Southern California.

Our GATE students take workshops at the Getty, presidential libraries, museums and local performing arts centers to deepen their understanding of the concepts learned in class. GATE students at Stauffer are supported in both their unique educational and social-emotional needs.



In order to prepare students to be competitively eligible for four-year universities, Stauffer offers Math with Computing classes for 7th and 8th grade students.

MATH WITH COMPUTING is part of the Engineering Pathways (i.e. Computer Science Engineering, Civil Engineering) that are offered in our high schools. This class offers mathematical applications through coding and robotics using modified versions of the most commonly used programming language C/C++. In this course, students will regularly use technology, learn how to write computer programs, program robots and develop problem-solving skills. This program develops 21st Century skills of coding and working with technology. It also prepares students to be successful in high school and beyond.

Math with Computing

The California Jr. Scholarship Federation (CJSF) is an academic organization at Stauffer Middle School.

Our chapter coordinates its guidelines with the California Scholastic Federation. It is an organization that rewards scholarship and service. The purpose of CJSF is to foster high standards of scholarship, service and citizenship on the part of California's public and private middle school students.

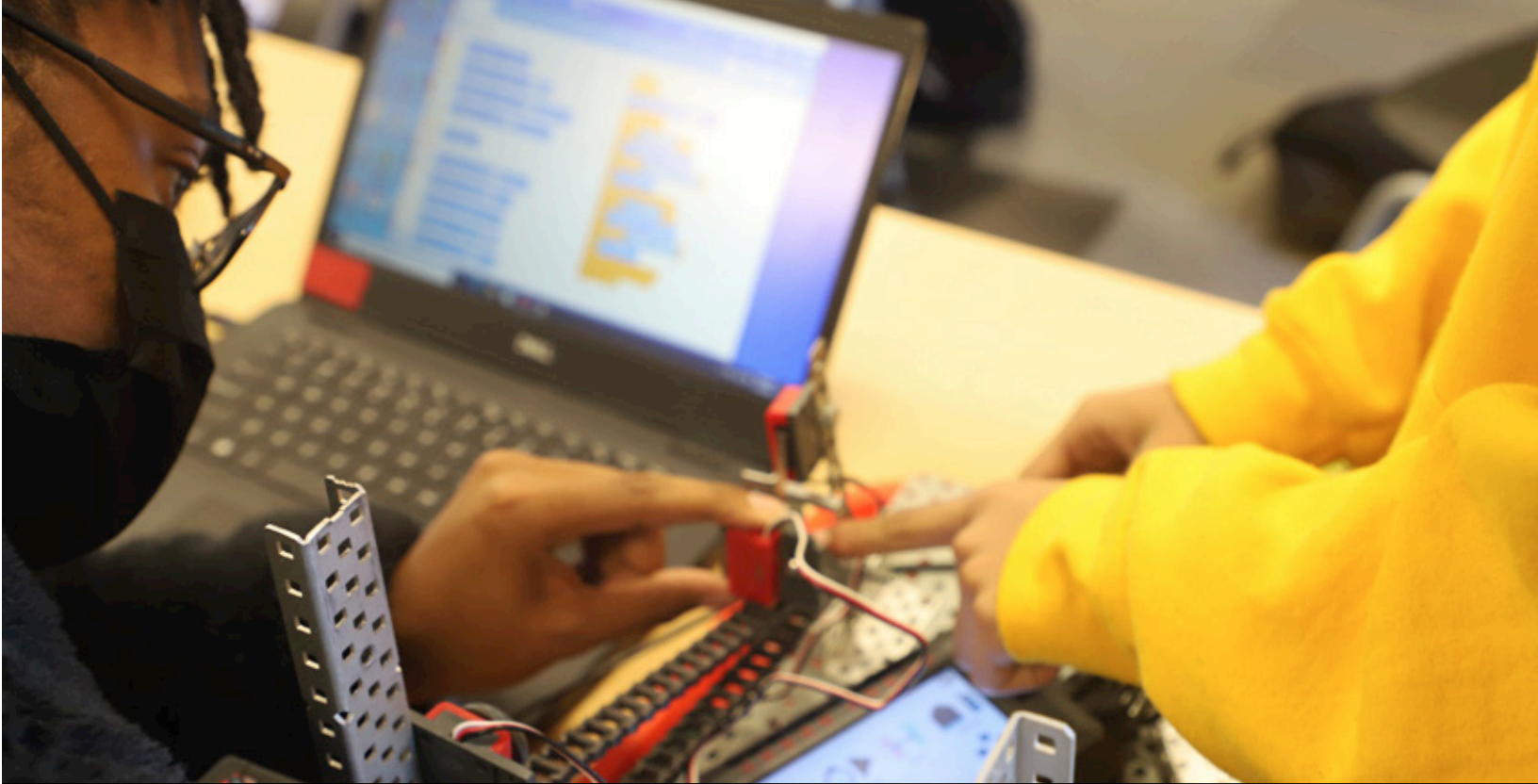
Femineers

At Stauffer, this highly creative program provides 7th and 8th grade students with project-based learning, female engineering student mentors and opportunities to visit Cal Poly Pomona, while building a sustainable program and community for current and future STEM leaders.

By engaging with real-world applications and hands-on activities, Femineers acquire the technical knowledge and practical skills necessary to become confident and strong in their future careers.





Career Technical Education

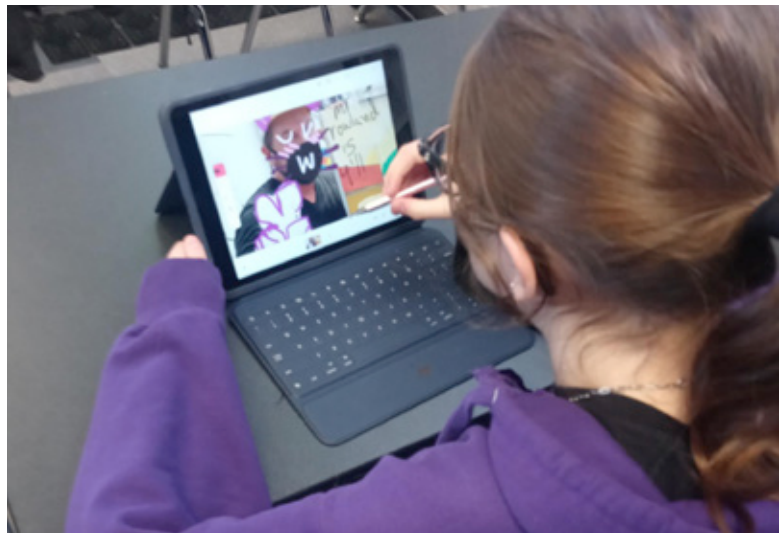
CTE Courses

Career Technical Education (CTE) provides students with the opportunity to acquire real-life skills to prepare them for successful, continuing education or entry-level career positions. Each CTE course offers relevant project-based activities modeled by professionals from the field. Stauffer CTE courses feed directly into the CTE courses at Warren High School.

Animation

Foundations of Animation teaches students the visual and verbal language of animation by watching and studying classic cartoons. Students will learn to animate motion while improving their ability to draw, work with others and tell a story using pictures.

INTRODUCTION TO CULINARY ARTS provides students with a thorough knowledge of safety and sanitation procedures upheld in professional restaurant settings as well as a broad knowledge of various cooking and baking techniques. This class provides a seamless transition into the high school CTE Culinary Arts program. Motivated and advanced students at the middle school level are also given the opportunity to prepare and pass the ServSafe Food Handlers Certificate, enabling them to accelerate into the 10th grade Culinary Arts program as a 9th grader.

Students also gain practical business management skills by preparing and selling restaurant quality food through their on-campus bakery at schoolwide event sales. Other subjects explored in this curriculum include: International Food Cultures, Nutrition, Health and Farm to Table Sustainable Cooking, all while utilizing and maintaining the on-site campus vegetable garden.

Culinary Arts

Film & Television

VIDEO PRODUCTION is a class designed for students who love making movies! Students study a film (action, comedy, horror and fantasy) and then create their own movie based on that genre! Students work in groups to write, film and edit their movies.

This class also produces the televised morning announcements, **SPARTAN TV!** Students are taught how to use the equipment necessary to film and edit on a green screen, and how to work in a timely manner in order to have the announcements ready each day!

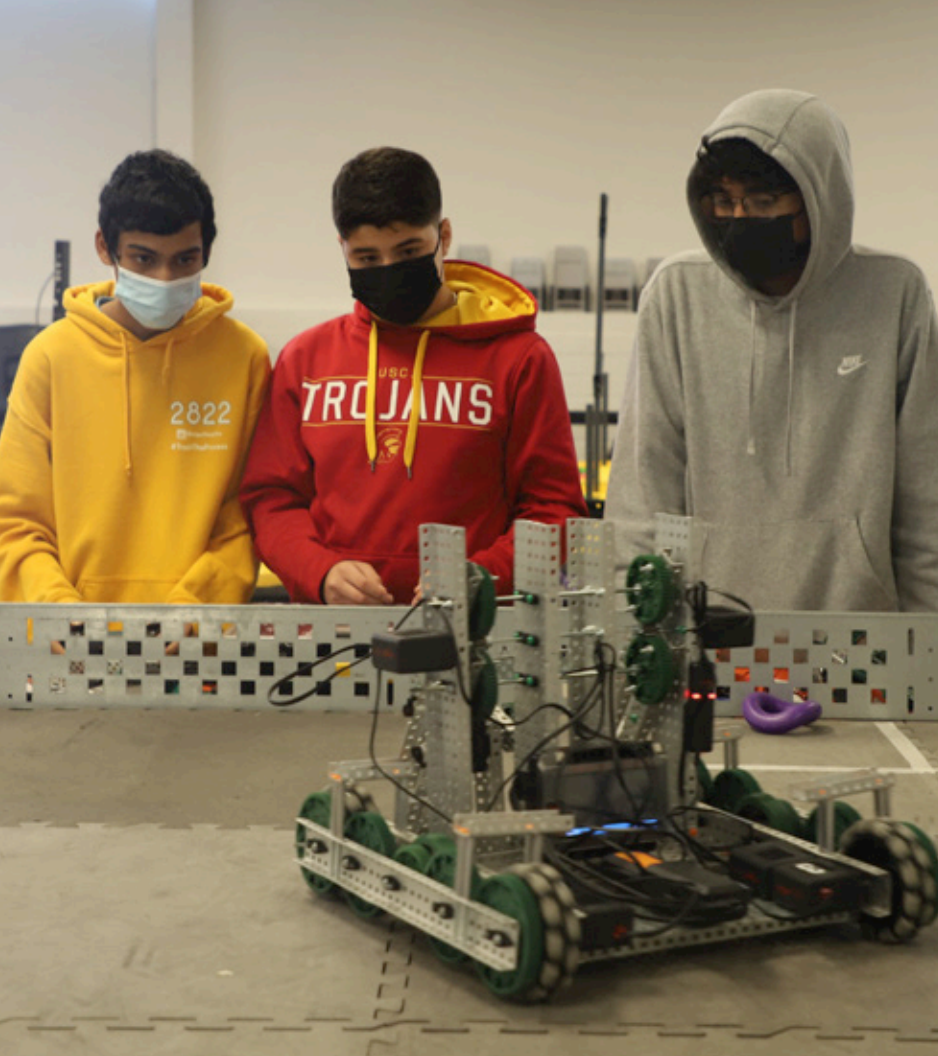
