



- Los Angeles County has met the threshold for the least restrictive yellow tier in the State's Blueprint for a Safer Economy. Today, the State released updated blueprint tier numbers; L.A. County's adjusted case rate dropped from 1.9 new cases per 100,000 people to 1.6 new cases per 100,000. The overall test positivity rate dropped from 0.9% to 0.7%, and in areas with the fewest health affirming resources, L.A. County's test positivity rate dropped from 1.0% to 0.8%.
- A revised Los Angeles County Health Officer Order will go into effect on Thursday, May 6, to reflect newly permitted activities.

# What does Yellow Tier Mean?

- Moving to the yellow tier would mean further easing of capacity restrictions at businesses, gatherings and events, both indoors and outdoors. Fitness centers, cardrooms, wineries and breweries, for instance, would be permitted to increase indoor capacity to 50%, up from the current 25%; bars would be able to open indoors at 25% of capacity; outdoor venues such as Dodger Stadium could increase capacity to 67%, up from the current 33%; and amusement parks could allow 35% of capacity, up from 25%.

# FDA clears Pfizer shot for children as young as 12

- NEW YORK — COVID-19 vaccines finally are headed for more kids as U.S. regulators on Monday expanded use of Pfizer's shot to those as young as 12, sparking a race to protect middle and high school students before they head back to class in the fall.
- Shots could begin as soon as a federal vaccine advisory committee issues recommendations for using the two-dose vaccine in 12- to 15-year-olds, expected Wednesday.

# COVID: UC, CSU and Stanford plan to require students to be vaccinated

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The California State University and University of California systems are moving forward with plans to require students, faculty and staff to be vaccinated against the coronavirus before on-campus instruction begins this fall.

### Important Update Regarding CSU COVID-19 Vaccine Requirements

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To the Campus Community:

Today the CSU and UC systems announced their intention to require COVID-19 vaccination for all students and staff starting in fall 2021 - a crucial step in conquering the coronavirus. The policy contains some important qualifications and safeguards:

- The policy will only go into effect once the FDA has fully approved at least one vaccine, and that vaccine is adequately available to everyone. (At the moment, the vaccines are only approved under an Emergency Use Authorization.) This requirement will become effective at the beginning of the fall 2021 term, or upon full FDA approval of the vaccine, whichever occurs later.
