

DOWNEY UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT EXPOSURE GUIDELINES FOR STUDENTS

Re: Isolation and Quarantine (Updated 1/20/22 @ 10:30am)

The intent of these guidelines is to provide general information for DUSD families should a student be in close contact to <u>or</u> diagnosed with COVID-19. Guidelines will be updated as new information is obtained from the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health (LACDPH).

ISOLATION =	QUARANTINE =
if you test positive for COVID-19	if you were in close contact to someone with COVID-19
 Isolation keeps someone who is sick or has tested positive for COVID-19 away from others, even in their own home People who are in isolation should stay home, stay in a specific "sick room" or area and use a separate bathroom (if available). 	 Quarantine is used to keep someone who has been in close contact to a person with COVID-19 away from others if you have been in close contact with a person diagnosed with COVID-19 you are required to quarantine unless you are exempt*

*EXEMPT FOR STUDENT= FULLY VACCINATED (Two-dose vaccine - Booster not required for students)

WHAT DOES <u>CLOSE CONTACT</u> MEAN?

- You were within 6 feet of someone who tested positive for COVID-19 a total of 15 minutes or more over a 24-hour period
- You had unprotected contact with body fluids and/or secretions from someone who tested positive for COVID-19 For example, if you were coughed or sneezed on, you shared a drinking cup or eating utensils, you kissed, or you provided care to them without wearing the right protective equipment.

WHAT HAPPENS IF I AM COVID-19 POSITIVE?

How do I return to school after I tested positive?

At least 5 days have passed since your symptoms first appeared:

AND you have a negative COVID-19 rapid antigen test 5 days or later after the initial positive test;

AND you have no symptoms or symptoms improve

AND you are fever-free for 24 hours without using a fever reducing medication, you may return the following day

PROVIDE/UPLOAD A PICTURE OR COPY OF YOUR NEGATIVE COVID-19 TEST RESULTS UPON RETURN TO SCHOOL

What if I still have a fever beyond 5 days?

• If fever remains present, your isolation needs to be continued until the fever resolves without the use of fever reducing medication

What if I do not take a second COVID-19 test after I have tested positive?

• Those who are unable to test or choose not to test, and symptoms are not present or are resolving, your isolation can end after day 10.

WHAT HAPPENS IF I AM A CLOSE CONTACT TO COVID-19?

NO QUARANTINE REQUIRED

What happens if I am A CLOSE CONTACT to COVID-19 and I am Vaccinated, and have received COVID-19 Booster?

- You are able to continue to attend school with <u>proof of your</u> <u>COVID-19 vaccine and no</u> <u>symptoms</u>
- You will take a rapid antigen COVID-19 test on Day 5
- You are to wear an upgraded mask (non-cloth mask of multiple layers of non-woven material with a nose wire) both indoors and outdoors for 10 Days
- You are to monitor yourself for symptoms for 10 Days
- If you develop symptoms, take a COVID-19 test and stay home and follow the isolation protocols if you are positive for COVID-19

What happens if I am A CLOSE CONTACT to COVID-19 and I have recently recovered within the last 90 days?

- You are able to continue to attend school with <u>no</u> <u>symptoms</u>
- You will take a rapid antigen COVID-19 test on Day 5
- You are to wear an upgraded mask (non-cloth mask of multiple layers of non-woven material with a nose wire) both indoors and outdoors for 10 Days
- You are to monitor yourself for symptoms for 10 Days
- If you develop symptoms, take a COVID-19 test and stay home and follow the isolation protocols if you are positive for COVID-19

What happens if I am A CLOSE CONTACT to COVID-19 and I am Vaccinated and I am not yet eligible for/have not received a COVID-19 Booster?

- You are able to continue to attend school with <u>proof of your vaccine</u> <u>and no symptoms</u>
- You will take a rapid antigen COVID-19 test on Day 5
- You are to wear an upgraded mask (non-cloth mask of multiple layers of non-woven material with a nose wire) indoors and outdoors for 10 Days
- You are to monitor yourself for symptoms for 10 Days
- If you develop symptoms, take a COVID-19 test and stay home and follow the isolation protocols if you are positive for COVID-19

QUARANTINE REQUIRED

What happens if I am <u>A CLOSE CONTACT</u> to COVID-19 without a mask and I am <u>NOT Vaccinated</u>?

- Stay home for 5 days (from the date of close contact)
- If you have a negative rapid antigen COVID-19 test 5 days or later after your close contact with a positive COVID-19 case and you have no symptoms, you may return to school the following day (provide/upload a picture or copy of your negative covid-19 test results upon return to school)
- Wear an upgraded mask (non-cloth mask of multiple layers of non-woven material with a nose wire) around others for 10 days
- If you unable or choose not to test, you must quarantine for 10 days from the date of close contact
- If you develop symptoms, take a COVID-19 test and stay home and follow the isolation protocols if you are positive for COVID-19

OPTIONAL MODIFIED QUARANTINE

OPTIONAL MODIFIED QUARANTINE = CLOSE CONTACT WITH MASK

What happens if I am <u>A CLOSE CONTACT</u> to COVID-19 while wearing a mask and am <u>NOT Fully Vaccinated</u>?

IF close contact occurred in school setting, supervised by staff; **AND** student was wearing a mask properly the entire time; **AND** student shows no symptoms

THEN student may continue to attend classroom instruction and may participate in sports and extra-curricular activities; <u>MUST</u> wear an upgraded mask (non-cloth mask of multiple layers of non-woven material with a nose wire) both indoors and outdoors for 10 Days

Student must be tested at least once weekly, Day 5 or later after date of last exposure. If test is negative and student has no symptoms, then student can be released from Modified Quarantine
