WELCOME FROM DR. GARCIA

Dr. Garcia gave an overview about the start of the school year and different byproducts of the pandemic, especially drug use and catching up academically. Dr. Garcia shared that this year has been one of the best openings since the pandemic. Dr. Garcia shared that after the last CBOC meeting, the board approved to put Measure K bond on the ballot. Dr. Garcia gave an overview of what would be covered if the bond passes. Dr. Garcia shared why the board wanted to approve the bond this year and not wait was largely due to the escalating construction costs. Danielle De Buhr asked about what feedback we are getting for Measure K. Dr. Garcia shared that people have been positive because they have seen that the previous bonds have gone to good use. Jeff Townsend asked if the campaign staff who are walking the neighborhoods are knowledgeable on the bond. Dr. Garcia shared that even if they don't know everything about it, they provide the website address and a lot of resources for voters to get more information. Jeff Townshend requested more information on the materials that were shared for Measure K to

voters by the campaign team. Jeff Townshend asked with the return of school did the district see more behavior issues. Dr. Garcia shared that last year when the students came back there were more behavior issues, but this year has been a lot better. Dahyla McDonald asked about the wellness counselors on campus and if they're helping. Dr. Garcia shared that they have made a tremendous difference for the students. Dahlya McDonald asked what credentials the counselors have. Dr. Garcia shared that the counselors are fully credentialed with Pupil Personnel Services (PPS) and are Licensed Clinical Social Workers (LCSW) or have a degree in Marriage, Family, and Child Counseling (MFCC). Dahlya McDonald asked about scheduling changes for Warren High School. Dr. Garcia shared that the feedback has been positive. Jorge Somoano asked about cost of money has still been going up, how does that go along with the rate and the bond. Dr. Garcia explained the max tax rate is \$60 per \$100,000 in home assessed evaluations and Vince Madsen clarified it's the value based on homeowners' tax bills.
