# Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF) Basic Principles

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- LCFF provides flexibility to school districts.
- The Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP) is required when a school district receives supplemental/concentration funding for the following student groups:
  - English Learners
  - Foster Youth
  - FRPL students
- The plan must be developed to address local needs assessed with educational partners' input.

# The Local Control and Accountability Plan

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- LEAs are required to develop, adopt, and annually update a three-year Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP).
- The LCAP must include:
  - Annual goals to be achieved for each student group.
  - Actions on expending the supplemental & concentration funds. (Actions tied to goals.)
  - An annual review of the effectiveness of the goals, actions, and services from the prior year.

# 2023-24 Local Control Accountability Plan

- **Six goals**

1. Student Achievement
2. Whole Child
3. Foster Youth
4. Best Staff
5. Parent Engagement
6. Infrastructure

- Forty-five actions to support the goals.

- Goals and actions target either English Learners, Free and Reduced Price Lunch (FRPL) students, or Foster Youth.
